### COVID-19 RESPONSE

The government of Uganda set out regulations in response to the coronavirus outbreak, and we have taken action to protect our students and teachers during these challenging times. Schools remained closed throughout 2020, as of March 2021 some have been allowed to reopen, and we have sent our students and staff back with increased sanitation and caution. During the height of the pandemic we supported the community with Quarantine Kits filled with food and medical supplies, and distance learning programs were developed to keep students mindfully engaged in their education. As always, we are in close communication with our Ugandan leadership team and staff to make sure everyone is taken care of and safe. Your support has made an incredible impact!

- Represents \$14,600 in annual recurring revenue for AIA projects





### FINANCIALS
